January 14, 2020

Kim Strizzi, the Executive Director from Maranatha-Carlisle, provided the club members in attendance with an overview of the services they provide to people in the Carlisle area who have not been successful in managing their money. They currently have 350 clients whom they help plan a budget and Marantha pays the clients bills with the client's money. Their clients are composed of approximately 1/3 on disability including some with a case manager, 1/3 seniors, and 1/3 regular wage earners who needs help making the right choice.

Financial independence helps with personal success which carries over to other aspects of their life. The clients are charged on a sliding scale from nothing to \$44 a month for this service. Marantha measures their success by being able to help their clients with income as low as \$783 a month be able to pay their bills and help them achieve their goals.

January 28, 2020

Shelley Candy, the Community Engagement Manager, from Child Care Consultants provided the club with an overview of the services they provide to Cumberland and York Counties. They help families find childcare including some funding for it when possible, and they help childcare facilities be their best. For a family to receive funding to help with childcare expenses, the parents living with the child must all be working a minimum of 20 hours a week. Additionally, they provide guidance and assistance to the various types of childcare centers including individual homes, group homes and facilities. Many of these centers are eligible for food allowances to provide healthy meals to the eligible children.

This is a good resource for anyone looking for childcare in Cumberland County, because they have information on most of them.
