This summer 168 students from Carlisle and South Middleton School Districts are enrolled to attend SPY. The schools continue to refer more and more students with a high-priority need. One afternoon during SPY this summer, I was doing work in the kitchen at St. John's while the children were enjoying a music activity in Fellowship Hall. I was trying to be discreet but apparently hide and seek is not a talent of mine because it didn't take long for a SPY camper to spot me. After asking for permission to get a drink, the young girl paid me a visit. I never turn down an opportunity to converse with a SPY camper, they are my inspiration, so I set aside my computer to chat.

"What are you doing?" she asked. "Working on some things for SPY" was my reply. "Like what?" She countered curiously. I answered her question with a question of my own, "Do you know who pays for all the fun activities you do at SPY and the food you get to eat?" The young child shrugged her shoulders, "You?" she said. After a chuckle, I informed her that, while I would if I could, I do not pay for SPY, and that part of my job was asking people for their help to make SPY possible. Her response grabbed my heart. "Please don't ask my mother. She works hard, but she doesn't have any money to give." This young child clearly recognized the work it took to earn a dollar and understood its necessity and value.

I explained to her that there are people in our community that care so deeply, they willingly share their money so she, and all the SPY campers, can have a fun and exciting summer. "They want to make sure you get to be around friends, have good food to eat and learn new things." As I was talking, her eyes grew wide, the fact that anyone would be willing to part with something so cherished, just for her, was astounding! A smile filled her face as she began to comprehend; she was worthy, she was loved.

Now, you and I both know that money alone is not what makes children thrive at SPY. It happens as a result of an incredible community collaboration. The saying goes, "it takes a village to raise a child" and it couldn't be more true. Churches give freely of their space, organizations share their talent and resources, and individuals lovingly sacrifice their time, all to make a meaningful difference in the life of a child and their family.
