Fred Boylstein, PEMA (Pennsylvania Emergency Management Agency), Central Area Director, spoke to our club at the first meeting in October. Central Area Office covers the Pennsylvania counties of Adams, Bedford, Blair, Bradford, Centre,

Clinton, Cumberland, Dauphin, Franklin, Fulton, Huntingdon, Juniata, Lancaster, Lebanon, Lycoming, Mifflin, Perry, Potter, Snyder, Sullivan, Tioga, Union and York.

Fred is a veteran of the U.S. Army, where he served for 20 years as a Military Policeman, Patrol Narcotics Dog Handler and Drill Sergeant. He retired from the military in 2001 and was hired as a Corrections Officer at Camp Hill State Prison.

In December 2002, Fred started with the PEMA Central Area Office where among other tasks, his duties included developing presentations of seminars, training programs or other educational programs for county and local emergency management agencies, elected officials, businesses and voluntary organizations. He also was one of two lead instructors and program managers of PEMA's Exercise Design and Evaluation Course. Fred has responded in a leadership capacity to a multitude of disasters in Pennsylvania and is an active member of Pennsylvania's Storm Ready Board.

Shari Bellish, Executive Director of Carlisle C.A.R.E.S.,

spoke with Exchange about the mission of the organization, "Serving the Emergency Needs of those without a home with Compassion, Respect, and Resources"

Carlisle C.A.R.E.S. has been serving the Cumberland County community since 2004. C.A.R.E.S. began as a mission through Carlisle United Methodist Church (then Grace United Methodist Church). After sheltering a few men for a night, members of the church and the community realized there was a much bigger issue that needed to be addressed. Initially, C.A.R.E.S. housed 3 or 4 homeless individuals during the harshest winter months through a network of 3 churches. Eventually, as support grew, C.A.R.E.S. was able to offer shelter year around to as many as 60 guests each night.

In 2010, C.A.R.E.S. expanded their services to meet the needs of the community. This time the need was a "day center" or the Resource Center. This building is a place for the guests of C.A.R.E.S. to shower, to do laundry, to receive mail, to cook, and to rest when they are ill. It is also a place where the guests meet with their supportive services coordinator. It is a place for our guests to call home.
