School-year Program for Youth

Summer Program for Youth, SPY, completed the camp this summer by using five churches to ensure social distancing. Sixty-five children were kept safe and nourished, received educational enrichment and had a fantastic time exploring the world of art for seven weeks this summer.

Since the summer program worked so well and many students struggled with the distance education in the spring, there will be a School-year Program for Youth. Students will be recommended by school professionals in the Carlisle Area School District as children who need a safe place to learn and grow while their parents must return to work and/or lack the resources at home for an effective educational experience. The goal is to help these students navigate technology, assist with schoolwork, communicate questions to teachers and keep them active and engaged in a positive and nurturing environment. The program will run 8:30 am - 3:30 pm on days during the academic calendar year that Carlisle Elementary Schools are operating in either Tier I (fully virtual format) or in Tier II (blended model).
